

ALUMNI PROFILE: CLLR DAVID NORMAN MBE



Old Westcliffian (1955 to 1960) and former Southend Mayor, David Norman MBE, is a Local Councillor for Southend's Victoria Ward. A retired Trades Union Officer, who was first elected to the council in 1965 at the age of 21 he is now a member of the council's Development Control and Policy and Resources Scrutiny Committees.

David was awarded his MBE in 2014 for services to adult education. He has been associated for more than 20 years with Oxford University's Ruskin College, being Chair of their Governing Body for ten years, having piloted many adult education initiatives and being key to the college's relocation

to a new building. He said: "I'm proud that my work with Ruskin College in particular has been recognised. I feel passionately committed to adult education as it can offer so many people a second chance at building a better life for themselves."

In addition to his Oxford University Philosophy, Politics & Economics degree, Councillor Norman was awarded an honorary Open University degree in 2011. David is currently a Local Authority Governor at Westcliff High School for Boys and the current President of the Old Westcliffian Association. He lives in Leigh-on-Sea with his wife, Jane.

OUR CENTENARY IN 2020

In 1919, as a result of the town's expansion post First World War, Southend's Education Committee decided a new Intermediate School was needed for boys and girls. "Belsfield" at 110 Victoria Avenue, a two acre site, was purchased at a cost of £7,000 (the equivalent of £148,000 in today's money). The School was originally called the "Commercial Secondary School" and opened on 27th April 1920. Buildings not far away behind the Chelmsford Avenue Congregational Church were also brought into use. By August 1921 the school's name was becoming a little confusing so it was renamed "Westcliff High School". By 1922, 372 children (boys and girls) were on the School's roll.

Westcliff High School for Boys moved to its current site in 1926 (the Girls School followed in 1931). The Boys' School's Foundation Stone was laid in 1925 by the Chair of Governors,

Alderman William Miles OBE.

Today, Westcliff High School for Boys is one of 164 (plus 69 in Northern Ireland) remaining fully selective state-funded schools in England. and has been rated four times by OFSTED as an "outstanding" School and placed by the Sunday Times in their list of the top 20 State Schools in 2015.



PUBLIC EXAMINATION RESULTS 2016

This year WHSB has enjoyed a tremendous set of A Level results. Over 15% of our entries were graded A* and 44% of all entries were graded A*/A. Nineteen students gained two or more A* grades and forty-seven students achieved at least one A* grade. The majority of students have achieved or exceeded their University offers, including nine students who have secured places at Oxford and Cambridge. The School also achieved its highest AS results in the last four years.

We also had outstanding GCSE results with 37% of entries graded A* and 72% of entries graded A*/A. One-hundred and nine pupils achieved eight or more A*/A grades and seventeen pupils achieved ten or more A* grades. We congratulate all our students and give them our best wishes for the future.



OWA ANNUAL REUNION DINNER 2016

On Friday 9th September the Old Westcliffians celebrated 90 years of the association at their Annual Reunion Dinner held in the School Hall. Past pupils and staff spanning eight decades enjoyed an evening of splendid company, fine food and reminiscing.

Chairman of the Old Westcliffian Association and Southend Councillor David Norman said "in 1926, former students set up the Old Westcliffian Association to enable them to keep in touch with both the continuing development of the School and each other. We are always looking to make contact with past pupils who no longer have a link with the School."

Old boys and girls range in age from recent school leavers who are 18 years old to 94 years of age and come from all over the UK and around the world. Many members still live locally, demonstrating the School's strong links with the local community, with their children and grandchildren attending the School.

Headmaster Mike Skelly said "We thank the Old Westcliffian Association for their continued support for the School. It is very pleasing to see that so many Old Westcliffians have continued their link with the School throughout the years. As the School approaches its Centenary in 2020, we now have past as well as current pupils and staff who are or will be fourth generation Old Westcliffians!"
