WELCOME FROM THE HEADMASTER, MIKE SKELLY

Welcome to the Autumn Term edition of the WHSB Alumni Network Newsletter. It is now a year since the School's Community Development Office launched the first edition of the termly-issued Alumni Network Newsletter. I am pleased to report that the number of connections we have now made with members of our Alumni community continues to grow. We are also extremely grateful to all those alumni who have made contact with us and for their contributions over the last year.

As reported in previous editions of the Alumni Network Newsletter, in 2020 the School will celebrate its Centenary. The School, originally established in 1920 as 'The Commercial School', was co-educational and located in Victoria Avenue, Southend-on-Sea. It eventually separated into Westcliff High School for Boys and Westcliff High School for Girls, with WHSB moving to its present site in 1926. We have just over two years until we reach our Centenary year and a planning committee is now in place. We look forward to working with the entire School community to create a memorable and fitting year of events to celebrate our first 100 years. We anticipate that pupils, staff, parents, alumni and our wider community will be involved in planning for the Centenary over the coming months. Later this year the School will launch a Centenary appeal with the aim of raising funds to improve the School's sports facilities.

ALUMNI PROFILE: KEVIN O'NEILL



Kevin O'Neill is Head of Neurosurgery at Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust in London, and an Old Westcliffian (1974 to 1981). Mr O'Neill qualified in medicine from St Mary's Hospital Medical School and Imperial College London in 1989, having obtained a BSc (intercalated) in Neuroscience in 1986. He embarked on basic surgical training, obtaining his FRCS in 1994, subsequently pursuing a career in neurosurgery, obtaining his final fellowship in 1998 and becoming a consultant in 1999. Mr O'Neill is now Head of Neurosurgery Imperial College at Healthcare Trust NHS (Charing and Cross. Hammersmith St Mary's Hospitals). Specialising in neurovascular and neuro-oncology, his main research interest lies in developing new technologies and treatments focusing on brain tumour research. He heads up the brain tumour clinical service at Imperial College and a centre of excellence programme translation research aimed at developing and testing new

treatment strategies. Mr O'Neill particularly enjoys the application of science and technology to medicine, utilising new technologies and approaches to solving the complexity of disease states, of which brain tumours are one of the most complex. Earlier this year, Mr O'Neill appeared in the documentary series 'Hospital' broadcast on BBC Two. The programme recorded Mr O'Neill and his colleagues dealing with some of the country's most difficult and challenging neurological cases.

We look forward to Mr O'Neill joining

us as Guest of Honour for WHSB's Annual Speech Day in November when the achievements of students throughout the School during the past academic year are celebrated. It is anticipated that over 900 pupils, staff and guests will attend.

PUBLIC EXAMINATION RESULTS 2017

This year, WHSB has enjoyed its best ever set of A Level results. Over 22% of our entries were graded A* and 53% of all entries were graded A*/A. Thirty one students gained two or more A* grades and 16 students achieved at least three A* grades. The majority of students achieved or exceeded their University offers, including ten students who secured places at Oxford and Cambridge. The School also had outstanding GCSE results, with 45% of entries graded A* and 69% of entries graded A*-A (or 7-9). Ninety pupils achieved eight or more A*-A (or 7-9) grades and 19 pupils achieved ten or more A* (or 8-9) grades. We congratulate all our students and give them our best wishes for the future.

FORTHCOMING SCHOOL EVENTS FOR ALUMNI

Autumn Chamber Recital

Thursday 5 October 2017 - 7:30pm

As always, the WHSB Chamber Recital will feature a variety of music from all sorts of styles, from popular to classical. Performers will be selected from all age groups, showcasing some of the best musical talent that the School has to offer. Tickets are priced at £5 for adults.

"Copenhagen" by Michael Frayn Wednesday 11 October 2017 - 5:00pm; Thursday 12 October 2017 - 7.30pm

This play explores the meeting which took place at Copenhagen in 1941, between leading physicists Niels Bohr and Werner Heisenberg. Bohr and Heisenberg initially come together to develop the Copenhagen Interpretation in the 1920s and 1930s, reflecting their innovative work on quantum mechanics. However, the two become increasingly divided by the nuclear ambitions of the Nazi German and American governments. The Jewish Bohr, living in Nazi occupied Denmark, now inhabits a very different world to leading German scientist Heisenberg, and the strain of their once father-son relationship plays out as they meet again in Copenhagen. A production for scientists, historians, all students of human relationship, and those who enjoy excellent drama. Tickets are priced at £7 for adults.

Annual Service of Remembrance Friday 10 November 2017 - 8:45am

The Annual Service of Remembrance for the whole School will take place on Friday 10 November at 8.45am. The Service will run until approximately 9.40am and will include hymns, readings, prayers and music to remember the fallen. A wreath is laid in memory of those from the School who gave their lives in both World Wars and in other conflicts. The School's Combined Cadet Force (CCF) will also participate in the arrangements for the Service. Alumni are warmly invited to join us for the occasion, and for coffee in the Conference Room after the Service. Tickets are free but

Autumn Sinfonia Concert

Thursday 16 November 2017 - 7:30pm
