WELCOME FROM THE HEADMASTER, MIKE SKELLY

Welcome to the Summer Term edition of the WHSB Alumni Network Newsletter. As we near the end of the academic year, we prepare to say goodbye to those students who will be leaving WHSB at the end of Year 13 following their A Level examinations. As another cohort of most able young people focuses on important examinations and, beyond that, the next step towards realising education and career ambitions, I thank all those Year 13 students who have served the School in a variety of capacities. We are delighted to welcome them to the wider School community, following their departure, and sincerely hope we shall maintain contact with them through the School's Alumni Network and their membership of the Old Westcliffian Association (OWA). ALUMNI PROFILE: DES DESPRES

After 37 years of superb service at WHSB, Des Despres will retire from teaching in August 2018. Mr Despres joined the School in 1981 and, during that period, has taken on a number of senior positions including Head of PSHEE, Head of Biology, Specialist School Community Links Co-ordinator (pioneering the School's enormously successfully Science Roadshow for local primary schools) and Outward Bounds Education Co-ordinator. Mr Despres has always enjoyed a high profile at the School and many will remember his role in support of School sport.



However, it is perhaps his leadership of the WHSB Annual Ski Trip across the last 37 years that will come to mind for many current and Old Westcliffians. Across those 37 years, it is estimated that Mr Despres, supported by other colleagues, enabled 1,750 pupils to enjoy the experience of skiing. Should any Old Westcliffians and their families want to wish Mr Despres well in his well-deserved retirement he would be delighted to hear from you, although he has said that he would like to use the occasion of his retirement to raise funds for the Aaron Lewis Foundation (AFL). As most in the School community will be aware, ALF was set up following the tragic death of Lt Aaron Lewis, an Old Westcliffian, whilst in the service of his country in Afghanistan in 2008. ALUMNI OBITUARIES

Angela Skinner, Former Member of Staff (1983 - 2013)

Mrs Angela Skinner passed away on 20 March 2018. Members of the School's Alumni Community, amongst whom a number of current long serving staff, will remember Mrs Skinner as the former Head of Science at WHSB.

A member of the Senior Management Group and an outstanding teacher, Mrs Skinner was highly popular with students, especially those studying A Level Physics. She gave over thirty years of dedicated and loyal service to the School.

Following retirement, Mrs Skinner kindly returned (part-time) to School to assist with A Level teaching and to support her former colleagues. Outside of School Mrs Skinner enjoyed great success as a Senior Examiner for A Level Physics as well as working as an Ofsted Inspector. Mrs Skinner's contribution enriched the lives of generations of very many Old Westcliffians and we honour her outstanding contribution.

Professor WGP Lamb, Old Westcliffian (1931 - 1938)

Professor Lamb's obituary was compiled by Mr Raymond Batkin and published in the Guardian on 25 April 2018.

"My mentor, research supervisor and friend, the physicist WGP (Percy) Lamb, who has died aged 97, was a member of the celebrated King's

College London team that contributed to the unravelling of the structure of DNA in the early 1950s. His PhD work at King's was supervised by John Randall and as a result Percy joined the team led by Randall and Maurice Wilkins, which also included Rosalind Franklin, who was responsible for the famous "photo 51" that revealed the structure of a double helix.

Percy specialised in the use of light and electron microscopes to study the nature of cell nuclei. He worked closely with others including Rene Bovey, Marlene Friedlander and Angela Martin during the formative period of the research.

He was born in Southend-on-Sea, Essex, the only child of William Lamb, a civil and structural engineer, and his wife, Letitia (nee Scears). After attending the nearby Westcliff high school for boys, he went on to study physics at Queen Mary College, London, graduating with a first in 1941.

He was seconded to the Armaments Research Establishment (ARE) – the forerunner of the Atomic Weapons Research Establishment (AWRE) – at Foulness, Essex, where, throughout the remainder of the Second World War, he was involved in the measurement of blast waves. He wryly remarked that the main preoccupation of the wartime ARE work was "trying not to get oneself killed". He was with ARE until 1947, when he went to King's for his PhD. He remained there until 1952.



He returned to the AWRE in Aldermaston, Berkshire, where he developed specific instrumentation to analyse the effects of shock waves including the UK's first atom bomb trials off Western Australia before briefly joining JD Bernal's group at Birkbeck College, London, in 1959 to set up an electron diffraction unit.

In 1960 he was appointed research fellow in physics at the Sir John Cass College of Science and Technology (now part of London Metropolitan University) where he supervised research in the Ultra High Vacuum Group and where I first met him, in 1970, when he became my research supervisor. He retired in 1985 but continued working on many projects until well past his 90th birthday.

Percy was a versatile and talented scientist of the old school. He had a polite and somewhat reserved manner, but was a kind, loyal and compassionate friend to those who knew him well."
