### WELCOME FROM THE HEADMASTER, MIKE SKELLY

Welcome to the Autumn Term edition of the WHSB Alumni Network Newsletter. I am delighted to have this regular opportunity to provide a brief update on your School, but please do also visit our website and read the Westcliff Diary for further information and news.

Following a further year of outstanding public examination results at both GCSE and A Level this summer, I am proud to report that WHSB has recently been placed 36th in the country in the recent table of State Schools published in the Sunday Times. I congratulate our School community on this tremendous achievement.

Much of our most recent building work, specifically the refurbishment of the Technology Building and extension to the Science Building, has been completed and the rest is well underway. Pupils are now utilising the much-improved Technology facilities, including a state-of-the-art Food Room on the first floor. Work is underway on the Science Building will



result in an additional, full-size (90m<sup>2</sup>) laboratory. These further works will ensure that we can continue to provide an outstanding 21st Century education for our pupils whilst we have continued to expand, now entering the fourth year in which we have admitted 185 pupils into Year 7.

Our plans for the programme of events for the School's Centenary Year are progressing and I hope that you have now reserved the date of our Official Launch (1 February 2020) in your diary. This exciting evening will showcase the best of the School's talent, music and drama, and we hope you will be able to join us. Further details on this event and booking arrangements will follow during the next few days. Other events taking place during 2020 will include exhibitions at the School, a series of special lectures, concerts and drama productions, and a joint Garden Party with Westcliff High School for Girls.

A great deal of the School's success is due to the support offered by its wider community and we are fortunate to receive generous support from our Alumni, the OWA, the Parents' Association and families of our current pupils. Recent generous donations have enabled the School to purchase and install three flagpoles on the South Drive, providing a valuable training resource for our Combined Cadet Force; the Royal Navy Section, in particular. We are also grateful to Mr Berger, former Head of History

at WHSB, for a generous donation in support of History teaching at the School. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Parents' Association whose donation this term has enabled us to purchase a much-needed replacement minibus.

Continuing to provide our pupils with an excellent range of facilities and opportunities is increasingly challenging in the current environment of scarce public funding and we are so grateful for additional support. Finally, I look forward to welcoming many of our Old Boys and Girls back to the School for many of our events this term and next, including our festive musical and choral events this month. ## PUBLIC EXAMINATION RESULTS 2018

It was another outstanding year for A Level results at Westcliff High School for Boys with 20% of entries graded A\* and 50% of all entries graded A\* or A. In addition, a remarkable 80% of all entries were graded A\*, A or B. Nine students have obtained Oxbridge places and many others will be undertaking courses at prestigious Russell Group Universities. There were many superb individual performances, with ten students



getting three or more A\* grades. Four students secured 4 A\* grades and are going to top universities, such as the University of Cambridge, to read Medicine, Engineering, Economics and Geological Sciences. There are many delighted students who have achieved the necessary grades for their first-choice university.

We also congratulated our pupils on their excellent performance in their GCSE examinations in 2018. Having achieved 76% of all grades at 7-9 (A\*-A) their results are the School's best-ever GCSE results. Twenty percent of examinations were graded 9 (which the national tables value above a former A\*). This is an exceptional performance, with pupils rising

brilliantly to the challenge presented by the new GCSE examinations. In summary, 103 pupils (70% of all Year 11 pupils) achieved 8 or more 7-9 (A\*-A) grades, 27 pupils achieved a total of 12 or more 7-9 (A\*-A) grades, and ten students achieved the equivalent of 12A\*/8-9 grades.

These results place Westcliff High School for Boys among the leading schools in the Country.

# ALUMNI DONATIONS

We are very grateful to the family of the late Mr Leonard Tate (Old Westcliffian 1945 to 1950) for kindly donating Mr Tate's Westcliff High School for Boys memorabilia to the School's archive collection. Amongst the items donated was an Annual Sports Day programme dated Saturday 18 May 1946. Significantly, the programme states that it is the '27th Annual Sports' day, indicating that despite the War years and evacuation to Derbyshire, the School held a Sports Day every year since being founded in 1920. Of particular significance was the fact that it was the first School Sports Day since WW2 had ended, eight months previously. Another insight into the social historical context of the era

was the statement in the programme "It is regretted that owing to current restrictions, no food can be supplied." - a sign of the times as post-war austerity measures included food rationing which continued in Britain until 1954. The original programme itself is in wonderful condition with evidence that Mr Tate, then a First Year pupil, had personalised it himself over 70 years ago. Pencilled notes recorded where he had been placed in certain races and the School crest on the front cover had been coloured in!


We also thank Mrs Elaine Tucker and family for donating a whole school photograph taken in 1932 that belonged to her late Father, Howard

Stone. Mr Stone played a leading role in the Southend business community for more than 50 years, building an empire of 29 HW Stone electrical stores. He was also a Director of Southend United Football Club and was one of the founders of Essex FM. Born in West Ham on September 11, 1917, Mr Stone moved to Thundersley with his family when he was six. A pupil at Thundersley Primary School and then Westcliff High School for Boys from 1928 to 1935, he was a keen sportsman and talented tennis player. During the Second World War he served in the Fleet Air Arm and served on HMS Formidable. Mr Stone passed away in 2008.

# ALUMNI VISITS TO THE SCHOOL

We welcomed a further two members of our Alumni Community back to the School this term.

Professor Tony Barnett (1955 to




1962) visited in September, along with members of his family. Professor Barnett was School Captain in 1962 and recounted his involvement (as Head Boy seated on the stage), in the infamous 'Skeleton Assembly' during Henry Cloke's tenure as Headmaster.

Paul Sanders (1949 to 1954) visited the School in October and has very kindly lent the Community Development Office his copy of the commemorative Golden Jubilee brochure "Westcliff High School for Boys 1920 - 1970". During his visit, Mr Sanders' was

able to find a photograph on the wall outside the Westcliff Theatre (the Art Room during his time at the School) of a 1952 production of "The Zeal of Thy House" by Dorothy L. Sayers in which he appeared. He can also recall the School Community receiving news of the death of King George VI during the lunch break on 6 February 1952. Three members of the Sanders family have attended WHSB: Mr Sanders' son attended during the 1970/80s; and his grandson is presently a pupil in Year 8.

# ALUMNI: WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

We were delighted to hear from Old Westcliffian Ian White (1962 to 1966) who now lives in Australia. Ian was in classes 1B, 2A, 3A, 4A and 5A and represented the School at Rugby, Cricket and Athletics before



emigrating with his family to Australia in 1966. During his working life, within the mining industry, Ian has lived in Papua New Guinea and Africa. He settled in Australia with his wife of 46 years and they have two adult daughters and two grandchildren.

Ian said that regrettably he has lost touch with most of his fellow pupils and would be interested to hear from any of his old friends and associates with whom he would have been at Westcliff back in the 1960s.
